

Puppy Pages

A few tips for proud owners of new puppies



The quiet little thing you brought home is now a raging terror!!







Why?

- Your pup is now used to their new surroundings. It's no longer strange & scary.
- Your home is now THEIR home.
- You & the family are now their playmates, instead of the pup's litter mates.
- Except when asleep, your pup has boundless energy & needs to explore & check out everything.
- They have no idea that some things in the house & garden are potentially dangerous for young dogs or that some things belong solely to humans.
- To them, there's no difference between your expensive shoes & their toys.
- When they need 'to go", they squat & 'go'! They haven't yet learned bladder control & it hasn't quite sunk in that the garden is where they should 'go'.
- They're teething, their gums are sore & chewing helps. So..... everything is attacked by those needle sharp puppy teeth. This includes your hands, toes ankles, clothing, furniture & human skin that isn't made for puppy teeth!!.
- Newly arrived puppies don't yet understand your cue words.

And the list goes on!!!! & on!!!!!!!

What to do?

Time out is the best answer for an overly excited & overly stimulated puppy. Remember they just don't know how or when to stop.

- Calmly take your puppy to a cool, preferably darkish place & show them you want them to lie down & 'settle'.
- Stay for a little while then calmly leave, shutting the door behind you. If puppy cries & whinges, ignore them. They will give up & settle. It's you that needs the counselling because they can sound so pathetic!!

■The time frame for 'time out' should be a minimum of 10 minutes. After that, if puppy is quiet, you can either leave them for a while longer or let them out but keep things calm, just let them be with you & veg out.

Dangerous places & things

By now you should have puppy-proofed all areas where the pup is allowed to be free & unsupervised.

In the house

- Power points & leads.
- Cleaning agents & other household items.
- Food, such as meat cooked on the bone, fatty off cuts, onions, garlic, nuts, chocolate, lollies, avocados, grapes, raisins & alcohol (& many more!).
- Sharp knives that smell nice!
- Steps & stairs, especially the 'see through' type.
- Couches & beds puppies should not jump on & off furniture, as it can cause severe & long term damage to the bones & joints in their legs & their back.

In the garage & garden

- Power points & leads.
- Car radiator coolant, greases & oils.
- All garden chemicals, insecticides, fertilisers, cocoa mulch, seeds.
- All brands of snail & slug killer.
- All brands of rodent & cockroach baits.
- Heavy things that can fall on the pup (NB. Pups will climb up to explore).
- Plants such as bulbs, azaleas, macadamia nuts, the leaves & seeds of cycads, vegetables such as onions, garlic & raw potatoes. There are many, many other potentially toxic plants - Google 'plants toxic to dogs' for full list.
- Metal fence railings where pup can push his head through but can't back out.
- Small gaps under fences & gates that can be enlarged by puppy paws & provide an excellent escape route.

Toilet training

Take your puppy outside to toilet as soon as they wake up, **immediately after** a meal & **after 10 minutes** of play inside.

Sniffing the ground/floor & circling are signs the pup needs to 'go'.

Take your pup out every 2 hours during the day & wait till they 'go'. Calmly praise them during the squat & reward immediately they've finished. Add a cue word such as 'toilet', 'go wee' or 'be quick".

Biting & chewing

The game stops as soon as the pup starts mouthing you. Offer a toy as a substitute for your hands & praise when the pup transfers their attention to the toy. Ask your instructor for more information & help.

Tracy, Ginny & Karen O, the Rally O Sub Committee, thank each & every one of you.



A Healthy Dog is a Happy Dog

Bushfire emergency!Do you have a plan for your pets?

At the beginning of summer -

- Place an easily read notice inside a window near front & back doors stating how many & what type of animals live at your home.
- Ensure your dog (& if possible, your cat) is wearing a collar with clear ID your name & phone number are essential.
- Pack your pet's evacuation kits (see below) & keep them close to an exit door.
- If there is a lot of smoke in your area, make sure your animals are locked in the house (or put them in their crates) cats & dogs will often try to 'self evacuate' which can present a major threat to them as well as their humans if they are missing & you have to leave in a hurry!
- Relocate your pets to a 'safe house' well before an evacuation order is made.
- On a total fire ban or high danger day, try to have a responsible adult at home or notify a close neighbour, who can evacuate your animals if a bushfire starts nearby.

If you do have to evacuate

- Make your decision to leave **before** it becomes an emergency
- Secure your pets in the car harness or crate (loose, frightened animals can be very dangerous for everyone in a car, especially the driver)
- · Put their evacuation kits in the car
- Tell someone where you are taking them
- Remove the signs from the windows so emergency workers don't waste time looking for non existent pets

Emergency evacuation kit for your dog

Two strong leads

Spare collar with identity disc attached Small amount of dry &/or tinned dog food Some dry treats

Water (at least 2 litres)

Registration papers & microchip certificate Bed or blanket

Essential medications

Towel

Portable crate

A suitable muzzle if your dog may show aggression

Small first aid kit - bandages, non-stick dressings, burn cream, saline solution Favourite toys

Emergency evacuation kit for your cat

Secure cat crate or basket

Small amount of dry &/or tinned cat food Water

Microchip certificate

Essential medications

Small bag of kitty litter

Large animal emergency evacuation

Horses & other large animals have to be taken to specific evacuation centres.

Check with local Fire, Police or other emergency groups to find out where you should take them.

Help is available via the Hornsby/Ku-ring-gai Local Agriculture & Animal Group

In an emergency Police will direct you to the help you need

Fun ways to keep your dog cool & entertained on a hot day

Frozen treats It takes quite a while to lick down to the centre 'prize'

Freeze salt free chicken or beef broth & a few pieces of kibble in small takeaway containers. You can leave the block in the container or tip it out.

Stuff a Kong with some mince meat mixed with peanut butter then freeze it.

Fill an ice block tray with water, put a cube of meat in each hole & freeze. Or use paddle pop makers instead of the ice block tray.

Ice blocks can be given on the ground or placed in the dog's water bowl.

Freeze a very large marrow bone. Give the frozen bone to your dog for 15-30 minutes. Take the bone back again & refreeze it for another day. (The dog won't mind if there are a few bits of grass or a bit of dirt on it the second time around!!)



Water fun

Fill half a clam shell wading pool with sand & the other half with water - many hours of fun at the beach at home! Fetch the ball, get the rubber ring, etc



In a shady place, turn on a sprinkler - children & dogs will love it!

Indoor games Let your dog inside to share the air conditioning

Find No 1

Tell your dog to sit & stay (or get someone to hold their collar) go into the next room & scatter a few bits of kibble. Return to your dog & tell them to 'find'.

Find No2

Play 'find the toy' - again dog sits & stays whilst you hide a toy.

Find No3

Children can also do the hiding, the dog then has to find them.

Training

You can practise exercises like settle on your mat, sit & stay, down & stay, come & sit in front & 'puppy aerobics' - sit, drop, sit, stand & repeat.

Tricks

Teach roll over, shake hands, weave through your legs, walk backwards, speak on command - the list is endless. Just use your imagination

And let your dog have a cool, quiet, undisturbed sleep

Become a Foster Carer



NSDTC Inc VACCINATION POLICY

Up-dated September 2010

- NSDTC requires a minimum C3 (distemper, hepatitis, parvovirus) vaccination administered after the age of 12 weeks for all puppies less than 12 months old.
 - <u>Please Note.</u> A delay of two weeks after the final puppy vaccinations is required before puppies are permitted to join classes.
- All adult dogs (over 12 months old) joining or renewing, must have had at least a C3 vaccination administered after 12 months of age. Triennial (3-yearly) C3 vaccination is considered acceptable thereafter.
- Dogs joining or renewing over the age of 4 years that have not had aC3 vaccination in the preceding 3 years must be referred to the Club Vet officer or official nominee.
- Veterinary certificates showing adequate antibody titres* to distemper, hepatitis & parvovirus will be accepted by NSDTC for all adult dogs as long as they are dated within the preceding 12 months.
 - *Adequate antibody titres for distemper, hepatitis & parvovirus are considered to be > 1: 20
- As Bordetella & Parainfluenza (both agents causing canine cough) are not generally life threatening to healthy dogs, these vaccinations would be optional, but recommended & owners are reminded these may be required by boarding kennels.
- All vaccination & antibody titre certificates must be signed by a registered veterinary surgeon.
- · Homeopathic 'vaccinations' will not be accepted.

PARKING

- · Please park on the LEFT of the road as you enter the showground or near the picnic area beside the Douglas Pickering Pavilion.
- The parking area on the right, nearer the Clubhouse, is for 'on duty' Club Members who need to leave their dogs in the car, carry equipment, etc. Thank you.

CLUB & USE of GROUND GUIDELINES

These guidelines are for the benefit of all members & the general public who use St Ives Showground.

- · All dogs must be <u>on lead</u> during club training times (except when off lead work is directed by an instructor during class).
- Dog droppings must be cleaned up & placed in a bin.
- Each week pay your \$5.00 ground fee at the Clubhouse. Collect your ticket & hand it to your instructor at start of class.
- Always wear your name tag.
- The dog rings are a leash free area EXCEPT on Saturdays.
- The main oval may be used for leash free exercise, so long as no other organised event is taking place.
