Northern Suburbs Dog Training Club has changed how we pay our annual membership and ground fees

NSDTC has now upgraded to an all inclusive annual membership fee. This means that we no longer charge ground fees and members are welcome to attend as many classes as they are eligible for each week.

Existing members

However, existing members have a choice for the rest of 2013-14. You can either:

- Do nothing and keep paying your weekly ground fee for each class you attend you do not have to upgrade this financial year, or
- 2. Upgrade your membership now to the annual fee and you will be **credited** with the joining fee you have already paid.

To understand the savings consider this:

- There are some 29 weeks of training left this year till 30 June 2014
- If you come to one class every week then you will be paying \$145, (29 weeks x \$5 a week)
 over the remainder of the year.

As a comparison, if you upgrade then the cost of the upgrade for ordinary members will be \$115 less your joining fee this year (so for single members \$115 - \$20 = \$95). So with the upgrade you would be paying \$95 for the rest of the year and not \$145 as above.

If you want to upgrade, forms are available at the clubhouse.

New members

All new members now join under the new annual fee structure.

The new annual membership fee is:

- \$115 for ordinary members
- \$30 for juniors, pensioners, instructors & management committee members
- \$20 for a second dog. More than that are free!

DogsNSW Endurance Trial 11 August 2013



Through the eyes of 'Bodhi'

It all started with a random conversation at the Royal Easter Show. Waiting for our turn, as you do at trials, mum got chatting to another person & somehow they got onto the topic of the Endurance Trial.

Hmmm... thought mum. This could be fun & off she went to check it out. The ANKC website provided most of the details we needed & a special thanks to Allison who did it last year with Stella & helped with what to expect. The idea behind the Endurance Trial is to demonstrate a dog's ability to work after being subjected to a certain degree of physical strain but not showing any signs of undue stress. Being able to do this Endurance Trial is evidence of physical fitness.

So, what did I actually have to do? Well the ET itself is a 20km run for me (run or ride for mum alongside me as I need to be on lead... my mum chose to ride). It is broken up into several parts. It starts with a vet check sometime in the 2 weeks prior. Nothing too bad with general muscle tone & paw pad conditions checked, heart rate & temperature (not my favourite bit!).

Then on the day of the ET we headed out to Erskine Park bright & early. Another vet check before we headed off in single file in a group of about 12 dogs & their handlers. We ran / rode around a 2km course. Nice & flat & over some grass, road & dirt track. The 1st leg was 8km (4 laps) & then we got a break. The lovely vets (volunteers from Sydney Uni) checked me over (assumed mum was doing OK). I had some water & a little rest (15 min) & then we headed out for another 6km (3 laps). Back in for another check etc (20 min rest this time) & then out for the final 6km & the last vet check. Before we started & at the end we had to do a little obedience type thing of heeling, sitting & a recall to show I was happy to work with mum.

Yeah, I was a bit tired at the end & when mum opened the back of the car to put the bike away I jumped in ready to have a nap... It had been an early morning too, but all up it was lots of fun. We met some nice people, dogs & wonderful judges & organizers. With the training we did in preparation it was a great way to get fit (think mum thought so too as she rode some days but ran with me on others) & to have some fun.

Fun games to start training for Agility

Want to do agility with your dog but not in 3rd class yet? You don't need to wait to start teaching some of the basics.

Here are some simple exercises you can try at home, on a walk or down at the park that will assist when you start agility.

Playing touch

While, at times, your dog needs to go out away from you, they also need to come back. A fun way to practice this is with a game of touch.



Initially just have your dog touch your hand, using a command like 'touch'. When they do, use a clicker or word like 'yes' and treat immediately. As they get better at working away from you, send them out, then call 'touch' to have them return.

Reward for coming back and touching your hand wherever it is - there is no need for the dog to sit in front as required in obedience.

Work with your dog on both your left and right



Most obedience exercises have your dog working on your left hand side only.

On an agility course your dog will need to change sides frequently so it will be important that they work equally well on both sides. You may like to use a different word for each side e.g. 'close' and 'side' for left and right.



Working away from you

After lots of obedience training you finally have your dog right beside you, but in agility you often want the dog to run ahead to a jump or an obstacle. Start getting your dog used to this idea at meal time. Ask them to 'sit-stay' and then place their food a little distance away. Release them with a send cue like 'go'. You can move the food further away over time or



put out a treat target (like a plastic lid) and send them out to that (see photo above).

Like Obedience training, Agility is about having fun with your dog. Keep these little exercises short, no more than 5 minutes, with lots of praise and rewards.

Agility is a fun way to spend time with your dog so we hope this gives you some easy exercises to start practising.

Agility training is held on a Saturday morning 9.00am -12 noon. NSDTC members with a dog over 12 months of age and in 3rd class and above are welcome to come along on the 1st Saturday of the month.

As the dogs work mainly off lead, the beginner's class is in one of the fenced rings. Our Chief Agility Instructor will do a quick test to ensure you and your dog are ready. To read more, check our website under "Training" – "Agility Training" or come along on a Saturday morning to watch.



- 3 new obedience instructors now 'on the beat' after completing their training.

- 2 new ANKC Judges qualified. Many congratulations to Tracy (Obedience) and to Ray (Gundog).
- Several performances within our community by our Demonstration Team.
- 10 plus attendees at Rally O training on Monday nights and all members take part in some Rally O exercises each week in class. More members are now achieving the higher levels in Rally O Trials with one holding the RAE Title and others currently on their way to this top qualification.
- 4 Educational talks:
 - Australian Support Dogs training dogs to assist the Physically Disabled to live normal lives.
- Fitness in Canine Training by canine physiotherapist Kristine Edwards.



Seek vet help at first sign of symptoms details in your NSDTC 'Green Book'



Adult - fully engorged



Shows size of fully engorged & nymph stages compared to human finger



Fleas - can cause major skin problems. Make sure your dog is properly protected



Snake bite - potentially fatal for dogs



Mosquitoes - transmit heartworm. Make sure your dog is properly protected

<u>Heat stress/stroke</u> - exercise early or late & restrict the amount of free play during the hotter hours. Ensure plenty of shade & cool water is always available

Car Safety in summer

Don't leave dogs in cars, even with the windows open. Temperatures can reach **fatal** levels in a **few minutes**

All you'll need to know

NSDTC Inc VACCINATION POLICY

Up-dated September 2010

- NSDTC requires a minimum C3 (distemper, hepatitis, parvovirus) vaccination administered after the age of 12 weeks for all puppies less than 12 months old.
 - <u>Please Note.</u> A delay of two weeks after the final puppy vaccinations is required before puppies are permitted to join classes.
- All adult dogs (over 12 months old) joining or renewing, must have had at least a C3 vaccination administered after 12 months of age. Triennial (3-yearly) C3 vaccination is considered acceptable thereafter.
- Dogs joining or renewing over the age of 4 years that have not had a C3 vaccination in the preceding 3 years must be referred to the Club Vet officer or official nominee.
- Veterinary certificates showing adequate antibody titres* to distemper, hepatitis & parvovirus will be accepted by NSDTC for all adult dogs as long as they are dated within the preceding 12 months.
 - *Adequate antibody titres for distemper, hepatitis & parvovirus are considered to be > 1: 20
- As Bordetella & Parainfluenza (both agents causing canine cough) are not generally life threatening to healthy dogs, these vaccinations would be optional, but recommended & owners are reminded these may be required by boarding kennels.
- All vaccination & antibody titre certificates must be signed by a registered veterinary surgeon.
- Homeopathic 'vaccinations' will <u>not</u> be accepted.

PARKING

- · Please park on the LEFT of the road as you enter the showground or near the picnic area beside the Douglas Pickering Pavilion.
- The parking area on the right, nearer the Clubhouse, is for 'on duty' Club Members who need to leave their dogs in the car, carry equipment, etc. Thank you.

CLUB & USE of GROUND GUIDELINES
