- · Sluggish & unwilling to move
- Vomiting
- Collapse & unconsciousness First Aid treatment
- Rapid & forced panting
- Rapid pulse Staggering Convulsions
- Glazed eyes
- Gums may be bluish, tongue deep red/purple
- Cool ASAP with cool. but not iced water especially back of head & neck, groin & armpits.
- After initial First Aid cooling, transport immediately to the nearest yet.

Rally Obedience Trial

We had 101 Rally O entries.

Maryanne Fazekas judged Excellent A & Novice Tiki Freizer judged Excellent B , Advanced A & B Linda Dibbin judged Rally Master

Sixteen dogs qualified in Novice, three in Advanced A, five in Advanced B, three in Excellent A, four in Excellent B & nine in Master.

Overall this equates to approximately a 40% pass rate.

Twenty two club members entered. Between them they gained seventeen qualifications (for those not familiar with Rally O they gained a pass mark!)

My first experience of being a RATG competitor

It was a hot Saturday as Ray, Sue & Bob set up the runs for the RATG (Retrieving Ability Test for Gundogs). Our judge was Lynne Elliot.

There have been many RATG's at NSDTC & in January 2017 we were all ready to give it a go due to Ray Temple's fantastic instruction.

The novice team was understandably very nervous as we ran through our pre trial exercises Ray has taught us to do to get our dogs ready. It was exciting to see both novice & open entrants from all over come for the day & we had wonderful support on the throwers by Sue & Kala. The day began with a tricky retrieve over a large jump. All dogs entered, except two, attempted the run with many of the dogs going around the jump to get the dummy rather than straight out & over & straight back. My Goldie decided that the water near the food table was more to her liking than the dummy.

After some wonderful finger food, made by Lana, we moved on to the next part of the trial. The second retrieve was 70 metres & all dogs entered attempted the run with some wonderful results. The dogs running in Open had the added difficulty of a double retrieve with the second dummy not being seen by the dog. Of course the boss (Ray) & his dog Rebel, ran a near perfect run & showed everyone how it's done.

We then moved to the rings near the club house to finish the trial with some obedience work. All dogs entered did so well we had a tie for first in Novice. Jerry, (our own NSDTC member) handled by Arun & his mum, had to play off against a visiting GSP who eventually won the day placing Jerry second in Novice.

Ray Temple took out first in the Open section much to the joy of our club members. The boss deserved the win. Well done all entrants & many thanks to all who volunteered to make the day a success for our Gundogs.

To Ginny Legh who manages to keep us all organised & to Tracy Geary, what a great Trial for NSDTC Rally O & Gundog work.

A Healthy Dog is a Happy Dog

Paralysis ticks are alive & well Check your dog daily

- Use your finger tips to go over every millimetre of your dog's body. Remember to include ears, eyelids, nostrils, inside lip margins, around anus & vulva or penis & between toes & around nail beds.
- If you find a tick, remove it immediately. You can use a tick hook (available from pet shops & pharmacies). Observe your dog very closely for the next 48 hours.
- If you notice any change in voice, any vomiting or gagging, wobbly walking, cough
 or difficulty breathing, get your dog to a vet ASAP.
- · Tick paralysis can cause death.
- Do not rely solely on preventative medications or tick collars they help but do not provide 100% protection. Use your eyes & fingers.

Don't' know what paralysis ticks look like? Check the chart in the club house.



Reward based training

What is it?

Reward based training uses **positive reinforcement training methods.** A suitable reward is provided every time your puppy performs a desired behaviour. Unwanted behaviours are ignored & not rewarded & will eventually self extinguish.

What does it do?

Reward based training results in your puppy being happy & keen to learn. They'll really enjoy working with you. They'll listen to you, pay attention & focus on you. Learning becomes an easy & pleasurable experience for all.

Types of rewards

Rewards for puppies come in many guises such as food, your voice, pats, cuddles & toys.

Value of rewards

Each puppy places a different value on each type of reward. Some much prefer food or toys, some really like pats & cuddles, some react most positively to your voice.

Food treats need to be very tasty, completely different to the food they get every day & it's best to have a selection in your treat bag. Being offered the same thing over & over, during an hour long class, can result in your pup losing interest.

When training your pup at home, each session should last no longer than 5 minutes.

So how do you reward your pup appropriately?

- choose foods that your pup sees as high value treats. Some of the favourites are devon, cooked chicken or sausages, small meaty scraps from a leg of lamb, a beef roast or a steak & a little cheddar cheese
- give treats generously & use a happy sounding voice when teaching & practising all
 exercises whether you're at home, out on walks or in a leash free park
- food treats for puppies should be tiny, really tiny no bigger than your little finger nail.
 You'll find you can quickly give your pup 2 3 treats of this size & they'll think they've hit the jackpot
- jackpots if your pup does something really well, then quickly reward them with your voice, lots of pats & cuddles & feed 5 - 6 treats in quick succession. Use the cue word jackpot pups soon learn the meaning of the word & will get really excited whenever you say it
- all rewards must be given within a couple of seconds of the wanted behaviour occurring otherwise they won't know what they're being rewarded for
- use a bridging or marker word, like yes, to instantly mark the moment when your pup did
 the right thing. Pups soon learn to love the sound of this praise word
- jackpots & enthusiastic praise are wonderful ways of waking up a lagging or bored pup (but make sure they've really earned it - ask them to do an exercise you know they do well, so you can excitedly give them a jackpot)
- as you progress further with their training you'll stop luring, but make sure you always have tiny treats at the ready & give them generously
- start by randomising the giving of treats & intersperse them with voice only rewards, in other words you'll keep your pup guessing as to when the next treat will appear
- once your pup knows the exercise you can reward with yes every time they do it correctly & randomise the giving of treats even more
- always remember, a particularly good response should earn a jackpot.

Make responding to your voice great fun. Even if you've forgotten the treats you always have your voice with you!

NSDTC Inc VACCINATION POLICY

Up-dated September 2010

- NSDTC requires a minimum C3 (distemper, hepatitis, parvovirus) vaccination administered <u>after the age of 12 weeks</u> for all puppies less than 12 months old.
 - <u>Please Note.</u> A delay of two weeks after the final puppy vaccinations is required before puppies are permitted to join classes.
- All adult dogs (over 12 months old) joining or renewing, must have had at least a C3 vaccination administered after 12 months of age. Triennial (3-yearly) C3 vaccination is considered acceptable thereafter.
- Dogs joining or renewing over the age of 4 years that have not had a C3 vaccination in the preceding 3 years must be referred to the Club Vet officer or official nominee.
- Veterinary certificates showing adequate antibody titres* to distemper, hepatitis & parvovirus will be accepted by NSDTC for all adult dogs as long as they are dated within the preceding 12 months.
 - *Adequate antibody titres for distemper, hepatitis & parvovirus are considered to be > 1: 20
- As Bordetella & Parainfluenza (both agents causing canine cough) are not generally life threatening to healthy dogs, these vaccinations would be optional, but recommended & owners are reminded these may be required by boarding kennels.
- All vaccination & antibody titre certificates must be signed by a registered veterinary surgeon.
- · Homeopathic 'vaccinations' will not be accepted.

PARKING

- · Please park on the LEFT of the road as you enter the showground or near the picnic area beside the Douglas Pickering Pavilion.
- The parking area on the right, nearer the Clubhouse, is for 'on duty' Club Members who need to leave their dogs in the car, carry equipment, etc. Thank you.

CLUB & USE of GROUND GUIDELINES

These guidelines are for the benefit of all members & the general public who use St Ives Showground.

- · All dogs must be <u>on lead</u> during club training times (except when off lead work is directed by an instructor during class).
- · Dog droppings must be cleaned up & placed in a bin.
- · Always wear your name tag.
- · The dog rings are a leash free area EXCEPT on Saturdays.
- The main oval may be used for leash free exercise, so long as no other organised event is taking place.
