PRESIDENT'S REPORT

The last year has seen a significant impact on our activities due to the COVID19 pandemic.

August and September saw the Club gradually return to training sessions, but no new members were enrolled until the summer, with puppy classes starting in December and full enrolment not until February.

All were saddened by the loss of a long-standing Life Member and instructor, Ginny Legh. She was keenly involved with Puppy Classes and Rally and was the point of first contact for all phone enquiries. Ginny is to be remembered in the form of a perpetual award and her generous bequest.

On return to training, members had to adhere to our COVID Safety Plan. To simplify mandatory check-in requirements, a QR code was obtained in time for our Rally and RATG Trial in January.

This trial was a success as usual, falling on a lovely summer's evening with a good number of entries, despite Northern Beaches residents, being unable to compete.

The large intake of new members created challenges for the membership team and instructors, all of whom worked very hard to accommodate everyone.

A DWD Trial was successfully run at the DogsNSW venue in February, then April came around and we held our annual combined Obedience and Rally trial.

Our Constitution needed a number of predominantly minor amendments, which were approved by the membership in May and later accepted by DogsNSW and Department of Fair Trading. More significantly, however, it was agreed that the Annual Membership would run for the calendar year rather than the financial year and renewals will now be accepted from late each year for the following year.

Everything seemed to be going well again and despite large class sizes, the club's dedicated instructors were catering to our many new and existing members.

Sadly, during this time we lost a very experienced Instructor and former chief, with the sudden passing of Liz Hatcher.

Unfortunately, the delta strain of COVID19 appeared in Sydney in June, and the Club was forced to cancel all activities after 26th June, due to the NSW Government's extended lockdown.

This also meant that we were unable to hold our annual Agility Trial, nor could we commence training in the newly introduced discipline of Scent Work.

Both the Agility and Scent Work trials have been postponed.

I know everyone is keen to resume training and competitions when the lockdown is lifted, under whatever restrictions might still be imposed, and all of us at Northern Suburbs are very much looking forward to welcoming our members back.

In the interim, a great initiative from our Obedience Chief instructor and her team has been the introduction of Saturday 3pm Zoom lessons, open to all members. The sessions cover a range of topics with demonstrations and the opportunity for interactive questions.

Although it has been a difficult year, I would very much like to thank the Executive, the Committee, the various Sub-committees and all our wonderful Instructors for your support and the great effort in helping all our members.

Hoping to be able to see everyone back at training again soon.
